Treasury

As president, I feel responsible for the club's finances. What did President Harry Truman famously say? "The buck stops here?" Is this true for the president of NOCCC? On February 17, Don gave me the password to our bank accounts. I performed a rough audit of the transactions and everything looked fine to me. Payments and deposits are being made regularly.

Jim is going to get together with Don to get the Jim Sanders' name on the bank accounts, so that we will have a backup member to do banking should that be necessary. I guess this is a repeat of what is in the minutes, but I think it is important enough to bear repeating. If I had it my way, then all financial transactions would be accounted for by creating records in an Access database. I am considering asking the board in the next meeting. If a majority wants to keep it the way it is, fine with me. It will shift the responsibility to all nine members of the board. Board Meeting Minutes February 7, 2016

The meeting was held in room 131A at Chapman University Science Hall. The meeting was called to order by President Ben Lochtenbergh at 3:08 PM. Present were: Ben Lochtenbergh, Don Armstrong, Bob Dickson, Dennis Martin, Larry Klees, Jim Sanders, Gerry Resch, and Richard Miller. Absent: Terry Dickson. Guest present: Rudy Lauterbach, Webmaster

Secretary's report: Bob distributed copies of the minutes for the 1/3/2016 meeting. Gerry moved, Larry 2nd, approved.

President's report: Ben announced that Dallas Hazelton has submitted his resignation due to health problems. He expressed thanks for all the service Dallas provided to the club over his many years of being a member.

Treasurer's report: Presented verbally. Financially we have \$1,500 in Savings, \$1,201.53 in the checking account. We received \$40.00 interest on the Money Market Account. We paid \$99.00 for the printing and mailing of the Bytes. The raffle produced \$38.00 (no report on cost of items). Donuts/cookies brought in\$28.80, and the cost was \$28.00. Ben noted that he sold a copy of the Bytes for \$1.25 to a potential member at a luncheon.

In response to Ben's inquiry, Don stated that only he, Don, has access to the bank account, as did his predecessor. Ben commented that it would be in the club's best interest that at least one other person should have access to the bank account in case Don was incapacitated for any reason. After some discussion, Jim announced he is willing to go to the bank with Don on Monday and have Jim's signature placed on the account so that he could provide backup to Don in that capacity. Ben noted his approval and thanked Jim for his response.

Don stated that he sometimes pays bills online rather than write a check. Ben asked Don to provide him with the password so that he, Ben, could review the account online.

For members, we have 65. For January renewals, there were 5 or less. There were 26 renewals over the last 7 months. Don reported he has not sent out letters for renewals as he's still working on getting the file in order. Ben commented that the renewal date in on the back of the Bytes. Ben recommended sending an email notice. Jim expressed his belief that a physical letter for renewal would be more effective since many people do not get the Bytes very long before the meeting and many don't seem to read it carefully enough to catch a renewal notice in it. Richard expressed his support for a physical letter since it also encourages the person to attend the meeting.

Don noted that Larry's renewal is not up to date. Larry stated that he has not been repaid for equipment he purchased awhile back in the amount of approximately \$90. The problem was the receipt was lost before the bill was paid. Some discussion. Don moved to pay Larry the \$90. Richard 2nd. Approved. Don then noted that he would update Larry's renewal fee and not issue a check. Larry agreed.

There was extensive discussion on the fact that Ben and Don are not using the same database. Don is working on the master DB but is having some difficulties. Bob is working with him in finding corrections for some errors and just in general learning to understand how it functions. The database has been maintained by various individuals over the years and there's no operations documentation so there's considerable effort in gaining understanding of the system. Ben received a copy of the DB a few months ago and in his role of providing addresses for the Bytes, it's opened the concern that the two DBs being used may be getting out of sync with each other. Ben noted that he sends email messages to Don whenever he makes a change to an address. Don didn't recall receiving any such messages, but he might have.

Another issue of concern that involved considerable discussion was the date to use for renewals: the Join Date or the Due

Date. Ben is printing the due date on the Bytes. There were comments that it's been noted from time to time that the dates being printed are not correct. Ben again asked if everyone would work on locating a member to step up and take over getting the Bytes out each month. He will continue to get the Bytes to the printer for the next several months.

eWaste report: Gerry will check if there will be eWaste pickup at the March meeting. He thought there would be but he'll check to be sure

Consignment report: The eWaste and consignment functions are both held quarterly but Gerry will confirm.

Raffle report: Gerry noted there was a good turnout for the main meeting which produced a good result for the Raffle.

February speaker: There was considerable approval of the presentation by the February meeting speaker. An employee of the Microsoft store in south Orange County, he gave an enthusiastic presentation of the new Windows 10 system. There were many questions asked for which he gave informative responses. There was a good turnout for the presentation, about 33 persons and that on Super Bowl Sunday! His presentation of the operation of the Windows 10 system was well presented and informative.

March speaker: Gerry confirmed Derek and Jeff will be present to continue and complete their presentation on the new game system they are building. Richard will contact the university and see if the presentation can be placed on campus news locations in hopes that students will be interested and attend the meeting.

April program: Since that month is the 40th anniversary of the Club, there will be no formal speaker. Instead, individual members will be requested to share their experience as a member of the club. There are a few of the original members still in the club. Their presentations will be requested. For the special occasion there will be ice cream, cake, soft drinks, and other special food items at no charge to the attendees.

Ben came to the board meeting with the names of two artists to vote on. Ben spent weeks arraigning artists for the April 3 event, artists who could draw a caricature for each willing NOCCC member. He dwindled the number of artists down to two. He read their final emails and answered all questions. There was considerable discussion regarding the cost, how many persons could have pictures drawn in the limited time of the meeting, whether only members could have pictures drawn or if non-members could pay to have a picture drawn. Ben had the names of two artists for consideration. After considerable discussion, Ben made a motion to pay up to \$250 to have an Avatar artist hired for the meeting. A vote was called: 2 yes and 3 no, others abstained, motion failed. Jim suggested having the club have plastic cups prepared with the name of the club and the dates. Another suggestion was to have Larry take photos of those present and photoshop the pictures with a club background before having the pictures printed and then picked up at the next meeting. No action on this suggestion. There will be further consideration given to the April meeting.

Bytes: Ben stated he'll put copies of the Bytes on OneDrive for the board members to proofread before closing the issue to be sent to the printer. One member told Ben he'd rather have his copy sent

via email/OneDrive. Jim felt that many rely on the physical copy to alert them to the coming meeting.

Museum project: Richard reported that we received another older notebook computer which was placed in a display cabinet. Bob reported that he's taken pictures of all of the items we currently have in the display cabinets. Richard and Bob will get together in the coming weeks to work on arranging the items we have received so far. We need to write-up the notice of each item so that data can be provided to the university to have display cards prepared.

Adjourn: Richard moved to adjourn, Larry 2nd, passed. Ben declared the meeting ended at 4:50 PM.



Access SIG and VBA SIG

In February, the two SIG sessions [Access and VBA for Access/Excel] were combined due to the subject matter. This month continued the analysis and review of the NOCCC Access database system. We started reviewing it at the January SIG. At that time we found an error is one report and fixed it. The goal of this project is to get



deep into the database system and gain a complete understanding of its internal workings. That's turned out to be a challenging task. But, as noted, it's also a wonderfully educational task due to the routines encoded within it, code that in most cases I haven't used.

We've listed 36 tables, 57 queries, 12 forms, 15 reports and 13 Macros. Not to mention lots of code within each of those tables, queries, forms and reports. Then there are the internal routines: a challenging but really interesting field of study.

A quick overview raised the issue that some [many?] of the forms and tables and queries may be out of date. That is, they were created to solve some function in the past and then when that function was taken care of, the feature and supporting code wasn't removed. Nothing can be removed before it's been clearly determined that it's not needed in the current use of the system.

Due to demands in other areas, not much work was performed during January outside of the SIG time at the meeting. However, much more time will be invested in the project during February. Hopefully, we'll have a good report of our status by the March meeting.
