This SIG meeting was different in that there was no slide presentation. I did not even bring my laptop computer or Chromecast dongle.


A problem? Not really, actually there were great benefits! The attendees could run the meeting to a significant extent.



Two attendees connected their smartphones via my MHL adapter to the overhead projector and demonstrated interesting stuff.

Larry McDavid did a first-class presentation in showing how his **solar cell installation** at his home in Anaheim operates. He used a few acronyms unfamiliar to me thereby displaying his expertize. We saw 22 solar cells on his roof and a number of antennas! His smartphone connected to the overhead projector showed real time information via Wi-Fi and the Internet from his home. We saw power generation graphs in real time! It showed when the sun came up that Sunday, maximum generation, and the times when the clouds were obstructing the Sun.

Larry also has a passion about time management to the 100th of a second. He has three precision time clocks, see image, two are Heath kits he had for decades. He has been trying to capture a moment when the clocks show a difference. With his fastest camera, all three clocks always showed the identical time! What he needs is a faster camera. Perhaps a challenge for Larry Klees, the Advanced Digital Photography SIG leader.



Near the end, I said, "All you need is an OTC antenna on your roof." He asked, "You mean OTA antenna?" I responded, "Yes." Larry said, "It is right there pointing to a roof antenna on the screen." It looked different from my not so old Over-The-Air antenna. I think we all learned something!

In addition, Bill van Horn connected his smartphone to the overhead projector and showed his solutions. Thank you Bill.

The meeting attendance was back up again! Directions to NOCCC from John Wayne-Orange County Airport (SNA) 12 miles:

Enter CA-55 N (Costa Mesa Freeway) crossing Interstate 5 toward Anaheim/Riverside for 9 miles. Notice freeway signs saying "Chapman University." Exit toward E Chapman Ave. Turn right onto N Tustin St. Turn left onto E Walnut Ave.

1) Turn left past N. Center St. for the **best place to park** in the underground parking structure (Lastinger under the sports field). Pay a small fee (\$2) to park Ask members or help@noccc.us about parking details, restrictions, and price break!

2) Turn left onto N Center St. On the right is the Hashinger Science Center, 346 N Center St. Orange California. Parking on the University side is free. Parking on the residential side may cost you a parking ticket or tow away!
