The meeting was held in room 129 of the Chapman University Science Hall. The meeting was called to order by President Ben Lochtenbergh at 3:06 PM. Present were: Ben Lochtenbergh, Robert Strain, Bob Dickson, Don Armstrong, Terry Dickson, Dennis Martin, Jim Sanders, Larry Klees, Richard Miller, and Gerry Resch.

Secretary's report: Bob distributed copies of the minutes for the 12/2/2018 meeting.

Richard moved to accept the minutes, Gerry 2nd, approved.

President's report: Ben noted that he and his wife will be attending a concert in February and will not be present at the February 3 main meeting. He'd discussed it with Robert who agreed to lead the main session.

Vice President's report: Don reported he received \$22.00 for the raffle, \$20.00 for a shirt, \$31.00 for the Consignment Table sales, \$23.95 from the donuts/cookies, and \$70.00 for two dues renewals. The cost for the donuts/cookies was \$27.70. He paid for the January Bytes of \$95.00 and \$50.00 dues for APCUG.

Ben asked if any new members who joined. Don replied no. Ben asked if any memberships had expired. Don said he'd have to check the file for that.

Ben noted that he'd sent to Don a copy of the Orange Bytes mailing list. Ben noted that if any members are to be scratched from the list to let him know and he could call them.

Gerry moved to accept the Treasurer's report, Richard 2nd, approved.

Club Shirts report: Terry reported that one shirt had been purchased for \$20.00. Terry noted that he has not noticed much interest in buying the shirts. Terry reported the shirt inventory was 4 new style for \$20.00 each and 6 older style for \$15.00 each.

Richard suggested that one shirt be included as a prize in the raffle where the winner can pick the size from the inventory. Hopefully, this would generate some interest in the members purchasing, and wearing, the club shirt at the meetings. Jim stated that he did not agree with including the shirts in the raffle. There was no further discussion on that idea.

Book Display report: Don displayed an updated list of books that he has been getting ready for when some books will be displayed. Don noted that he prefers to use the cabinets in the main hall entrance beside the door to the storage room rather than try to display the books in the display cabinets in the main hall. Those cabinets are difficult to open and cannot be easily handled. Don contacted the university to see if he could get a copy of the keys to the cabinets. He was referred to another group to whom he sent an email message but has not yet received a reply. He said that some of the conversation with the university personnel gave him the impression that the hall cabinets are not really being controlled, that they're rather just holding 'old stuff'. He'll continue to work contacting the university in hopes of being able to get the keys to the cabinets to be able to display the club's computer books. Ben encouraged Don to continue to at least begin by displaying 20 books to introduce the concept to the club members.

E-Waste report: No contact with any e-waste company so far. An effort will be continued to try to locate another e-waste company. It was a useful and desired function for the members.

Consignment Table report: Richard reported the sale of several small items that totaled \$31.00. The table is being set out at every main meeting. The items are being stored in both the club storage cabinet and in some boxes outside of the storage cabinet as there are too many smaller items to fit into the storage cabinet.

WEB Site report: Jim noted that he's only updated the calendar recently. He needs to update the copy of the Orange Bytes.

SIG Site report: Ben noted that he gave the last of the Programming SIG due to small attendance. He'll work on developing a new SIG topic. Terry and Robert reported that they had to move to a different room for the Linux SIG due to the regular room being flooded. The SIG counts: 3-D Printing, 2; Linux, 7; Photo, 6; Mobile Computing, 15, Programming SIG, 7; Access canceled. Main meeting count, 20.

Main Meeting report: It was a well-received presentation by Jim on the new features in Windows 10. Jim noted that he'll write an article for the February Bytes covering the subject

After some discussion, Ben noted that he'll make arrangements for the February meeting to have an APCUG Video be displayed since there was no person that could be contracted to make a personal presentation. Jim noted that he'll also participate in working on getting a video presentation set up.

The March meeting presentation has been determined as of this meeting.

Adjourn: Gerry moved to adjourn the meeting, Richard 2nd, approved. Ben declared the meeting ended at 4:05 PM.

Enter CA-55 N (Costa Mesa Freeway) crossing Interstate 5 toward Anaheim/Riverside for 9 miles. *Notice freeway and street signs stating "Chapman University."* Exit toward E Chapman Ave. Turn right onto N Tustin St. Turn left onto E Walnut Ave.

1) Turn left past N. Center St. for the **best place to park** in the underground parking structure (Lastinger under the sports field). Pay the small fee (\$2) to park Ask members or help@noccc.org about parking details, restrictions, and our price break!

2) Turn left onto N Center St. On the right is the Hashinger Science Center, 346 N Center St. Orange California. Parking on the University side is free. Parking on the residential side is a city violation that may cost you a tow away and a ticket!
