WinDirStat Program Review



If you have ever needed to know, or just wanted to know, how much of your hard disk is consumed by which programs or data, WinDirStat is one answer to acquiring that information. This is a free program. Depending on the size of you hard disk and the size of the files on it, the program can take a while to run.

Developer's Description of theBy Bernhard Seifert

WinDirStat is a disk usage statistics viewer and cleanup tool for Microsoft Windows (all current variants). WinDirStat reads the whole directory tree once and then presents it in three useful views: the directory list, which resembles the tree view of the Windows Explorer but is sorted by file/subtree size; the treemap, which shows the whole contents of the directory tree straight away; and the extension list, which serves as a legend and shows statistics about the file types.

What is better than WinDirStat?
The best alternative is WizTree. It's not free, so if you're looking for a free alternative, you could try Disk Usage Analyzer or TreeSize. Other great apps like WinDirStat are ncdu, QDirStat,
